Rosh hashanah new moons also shown <u>underlined</u>. Passover is celebrated at dusk on the previous evening, when using the Julian / Gregorian calendar dates, q.v. inf.

Sunset, for the determination of the start of the weekly Sabbath, the new moon, or an annual holy day (with the exception of Passover observance) is the actual point of sunset, just as the sun finally sets. It is not sometime within Early Evening Civil Twilight (E.E.C.T.) leading to Civil Dusk with the centre of the sun 6° below the horizon, nor is it within early Evening Nautical Twilight (E.E.N.T.) leading to Nautical Dusk with the centre of the sun 12° below the horizon, and nor is it within Astronomical Twilight (A.T.) leading to Astronomical Dusk with the centre of the sun 18° below the horizon. Passover, at dusk, is observed at the onset of Early Evening Nautical Twilight (E.E.N.T.), with the centre of the sun below the horizon by 6°, or a trifle more.

In calendar terms, things change slowly, but over time, the vernal and autumn equinoxes occur earlier in the year. *Wikipedia* (with added comment and clarification in square brackets):

The precession of Earth's axis of rotation with respect to inertial space is....called the precession of the equinoxes. Like a wobbling top, the direction of the Earth's axis is changing; while today, the North Pole points roughly to Polaris, over time it will change. Because of this wobble, the position of the earth in its orbit around the sun at the moment of the equinoxes and solstices will also change. The term precession typically refers only to the largest periodic motion. Other changes of Earth's axis are <u>nutation</u> and <u>polar motion</u>; their magnitude is very much smaller. Currently, this annual motion is about 50.3 seconds of arc per year or 1 degree every 71.6 years. The process is slow, but cumulative. A complete precession cycle covers a period of approximately 25,765 years, the so called Platonic year, during which time the equinox regresses....360° through all twelve constellations of the zodiac [taking 2,147 years to traverse each one].' *Encyclopædia Britannica*:

'Also moving with this wobble is the projection onto the sky of Earth's <u>Equator</u>. This projection, a great circle, is called the <u>celestial equator</u>. The celestial equator intersects another useful great circle, the <u>ecliptic</u>. As Earth orbits the <u>Sun</u>, the constantly changing direction from which the Sun is viewed causes it to trace out the <u>ecliptic</u>. The celestial equator is inclined at a 23.44° angle to the ecliptic (the so-called obliquity of the ecliptic). The celestial equator and the ecliptic intersect at two points called the equinoxes (vernal and autumnal). During the course of the <u>year</u>, as Earth orbits the Sun, the latter is seen crossing the Equator twice, in March moving from the Southern Hemisphere into the Northern Hemisphere and in September moving in the opposite direction. The equinoxes drift westward along the ecliptic at the rate of 50.3 arcseconds annually as the celestial equator moves with Earth's precession.'

### Trees in the Bible

In the Bible, 'trees' signify identified persons, or groups, or nations. There are several:

The tree of life and the tree of knowledge of good and evil: 'And out of the ground made the Lord God to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight, and good for food; the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of knowledge of good and evil. And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat: But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die.' The 'tree of life' symbolizes Christ; the 'tree of the knowledge of good and evil,' Satan. The 'tree of life' appears again, in the kingdom of God, on the new earth: 'In the midst of the street of it, and on either side of the river, was there the tree of life, which bare twelve manner of fruits, and yielded her fruit every month: and the leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations.'4

The burning bush: 'And the angel of the Lord appeared unto him in a flame of fire out of the midst of a bush: and he looked, and, behold, the bush burned with fire, and the bush was not consumed. And when the Lord saw that he turned aside to see, God called unto him out of the midst of the bush, and said, Moses, Moses, And he said, here am I. And he said, Draw not nigh hither: put off thy shoes from off thy feet, for the place whereon thou standest is holy ground. Moreover he said, I am the God of thy father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. And Moses hid his face; for he was afraid to look upon God.'5

God in the burning bush was the Word, the divine spirit being Who later became incarnate in Jesus Christ.

Two olive trees: 'And he said unto me, What seest thou? And I said, I have looked, and behold a candlestick all of gold, with a bowl upon the top of it, and his seven lamps thereon, and seven pipes to the seven lamps, which are upon the top thereof: And two olive trees by it, one upon the right side of the bowl, and the other upon the left side thereof. So I answered and spake with the angel that talked with me, saying, What are these, my Lord? Then answered I, and said unto him, What are these two olive trees upon the right side of the candlestick and upon the left side thereof? And I answered again, and said unto him, What be these two olive branches which through the two golden pipes empty the golden oil out of themselves? And he answered me and said, Knowest thou not what these be? And I said, No, my lord. Then he said, These are the two anointed ones, that stand by the Lord of the whole earth.'6

The same is referred to in the plea to Christ by the mother of Zebedee's children: 'Grant that these my two sons may sit, the one on thy right hand, and the other on thy left, in thy kingdom,' and in Jesus' response, 'but to sit on my right hand, and on my left, is not mine to give, but it shall be given to them for whom it is prepared of my Father.' Their purpose and identity is revealed: 'And I will give power unto my two wit-nesses, and they shall prophesy a thousand, two hundred and threescore days, clothed in sackcloth. These are the two olive trees, and the two candlesticks standing before the God of the earth.'

The barren fig tree: symbolizing the Jews of the time of Christ, 'He spake also this parable: A certain man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came and sought fruit thereon, and found none. Then said he unto the dresser of his vineyard, Behold, these three years I come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and find none: cut it down; why cumbereth it the ground? And he answering said unto him, Lord, let it alone this year also; till I shall dig about it, and dung it: And if it bear fruit, well; and if not, then after that thou shalt cut it down.'10

The tree about to be felled: symbolizing the generation at the time of Christ, 'But when he [John] saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees come to his baptism, he said unto them, O generation of vipers, who hath warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bring forth therefore fruits meet to repentance: And think not to say within yourselves, We have Abraham to our father: for I say unto you, that God is able of these stones to raise up children unto Abraham. And now also the axe is laid unto the root of the trees: therefore every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire.'11 'And now also the axe is laid unto the root of the trees: every tree thereof which bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire. And the people asked him, saying, What shall we do then?'12

'Parable of the Fig-tree: 13 Here is a parable at one and the same time lit by grace and close-packed with warnings:

Luke 13:6-9's dunging the fig tree for a further, fourth year has no connection with the length of Christ's ministry, as it is contingent, but the three former years have, as have three of the ten 'virgins' of Mat 25:1-13. q.v. sup. The record in the book of John gives a two-and-a-half year ministry, with a prefatory half year largely being devoted to preparation and trial. There is a possible corollary here, in that the first half year of the year of release—from 7 April to 29 September, 2027AD—is but preparatory to the work done by Christ on earth after His return to the mount of Olives, following immediately upon the 'Day of the Lord,' q.v., the time of tribulation and punishment of the wicked. The fourth year of Luke 13:8,9 then becomes forty years, as the time of probation of the Jews, and, in light of their failure to repent, culminating in the destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple at the hands of the Romans.

- 1. The fig-tree occupied a specially favoured position. In Palestine it was not unusual to see fig-trees, thorn-trees, and apple-trees in vineyards. The soil was so shallow and poor that trees were grown wherever there was soil to grow them; but the fact remains the fig-tree had a more than average chance; and it had not proved worthy of it. Repeatedly, directly and by implication, Jesus reminded men that they would be judged according to the opportunities they had;<sup>14</sup>
- 2. Clearly the parable teaches us that uselessness invites disaster;
- 3. Further, the parable teaches that nothing which only takes out can survive;
- 4. This parable tells us of the gospel of the second chance. A fig-tree normally takes three years to reach maturity. If it is not fruiting by that time it is not likely to fruit. But this fig-tree was given a second chance; and,
- 5. But this parable makes it quite clear that there is a final chance.'15

Also related, in the form of a tended vineyard, again symbolizing the Jews at the time of Christ: 'He will miserably destroy those wicked men, 16 and will let out his vineyard unto other husbandmen, which shall render him the fruits in due season.'17 This, appearing at the conclusion of the parable of the vineyard, where-in the wicked husbandmen kill the son of the owner of the vineyard—an analogy to the Jews' involvement in the death of Jesus—has Christ pronouncing: 'Therefore I say unto you, the kingdom of God shall be taken from you, and shall be given to a nation 18 that will bring forth the fruits.'19 And again: 'He shall come and destroy these husbandmen, and shall give the vineyard to others. And when they heard it, they said, God forbid.'20

# Mystical Statue, Mystical Law

The strange linkage between personal privacy trades-off and certain aspects of maritime and international law and what they entail can be seen in the mystical meaning of the likes of the Statue of Liberty.<sup>23</sup> This has been held as a symbol of freedom to many since it was erected on Bedloe's Island,<sup>24</sup> but is that so?

The statue was created out of political struggles. The simple tale is that the generous French offered the Liberty statue as a gift, honouring America's cherished ideals of freedom and opportunity for all. The true circumstances, of course, were much more convoluted. The idea for the Statue of Liberty first took hold of the imagination of its sculptor, Frederic Auguste Bartholdi, during a dinner party at the home of Eduoard-Rene Lefebvre de Laboulaye, a French intellectual and activist who hoped to sponsor an enormous monument that might serve as propaganda against the conservative leaders of the then shaky French government. Bartholdi had long wanted to create a most colossal and impressive structure, and Laboulaye named him to create what Laboulaye envisioned as a powerful political lever for shaping French government and society.

The first conversations<sup>25</sup> with Laboulaye occurred more than fifteen years before the Statue of Liberty would actually stand within New York harbour. During this period, Laboulaye rose quickly to prominence within the French government, pushing an amendment through the chambers of parliament that essentially called for the establishment of republican status for France. The result was the 'Third Republic.' To fortify their regime, the leaders strongly advocated the completion of Bartholdi's statue. 'What better way to cement their image of France than with a truly grandiose monument linking the history and destiny of France with the great modern republican state, the America that had not only triumphed over its internal enemies but was ascendant in every sphere, already marked to be one of the great world powers?'<sup>26</sup>

Bartholdi manipulated the Statue of Liberty to ensure coherence with this agenda. He positioned her within New York Harbour to face outward toward Europe, and particularly France, looking across the Atlantic in hope that Europe's countries might soon realise her strength. Not laden with the swords and shields of war and imperialism, but instead standing resolute with a torch to 'enlighten the world' to democracy, the Statue of Liberty was built to be a glorious icon of France's republican ideals. Someday, Laboulaye and his followers hoped, their own country would grow stronger by recognising her strength.

Trachtenberg describes the Statue of Liberty as a 'syntho-morphosis' of forms, a term used to describe its provenance and mutation; what is fundamentally the ancient goddess of liberty, known as Athena or Mine-

rva, wears a seven-pointed liberty hat, signifying the rays of the sun: the power of the sun-god.<sup>27</sup> It is often referred to as 'the sunburst cap,' an allusion to the headgear of the Colossus of Rhodes, a monument to the sun-god Helios standing to one side of or astride the entrance to that harbour. It is also evocative of the ancient Phrygian<sup>28</sup> tiara or hat, which Liberty can also be seen wearing, variously in other statues in the country and on coins.<sup>29</sup> The Phrygian head-dress signified a pseudo-freedom: 'freedom' from the Law of God. Phrygians considered themselves 'free of the law,' 'beyond the law,' and 'untouched by the law.' Phrygia was debauched, even by ancient Greek standards. The tablet of law which the Statue of Liberty holds in her left hand is man's law, not God's, and is inscribed with the date of the Declaration of Independence.<sup>30</sup> The torch of freedom held aloft, redolent of the 'eternal fire of Vesta,' signifies the claimed eternal nature of this 'freedom,' and the 'light of liberty and democracy' to the repressed masses of humanity. Unfortunately, democracy—the will of the people—has absolutely nothing to do with God.

Thus the law that the goddess of liberty represents is purely and exclusively man's law. Standing in the sea, she represents, in part, the law of the sea—part of what is now termed the 'global commons' or 'common treasury'—also known as Admiralty law. Admiralty law is international, and does not recognise any national sovereignty. It has to do with privileges, not rights. Those who would cite the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea,<sup>31</sup> modified by the Implementing Agreement,<sup>32</sup> as proof of the recognition of national sovereignty on the part of the one hundred and thirty national signatories in the United Nations, should first consider the following:

- 1. The United States of America has not yet ratified U.N.C.L.O.S.;
- 2. It is merely a Convention;
- 3. The legal framework underpinning it does not bring down mandatory penalties for infraction—it merely seeks to clarify the powers of coastal and other states in the various maritime zones;
- 4. Beyond existing and very limited territorial waters, it does not confer any sovereignty, but merely 'exclusive' economic zones, fishing rights, environmental protection and the like, while maintaining freedom of navigation, easement rights for pipelines and cables, etc;

- 5. It does not regulate armed conflict in connection with these zones, or provide mandatory legislative alternatives; and,
- 1. Where important interests are at stake, UNCLOS finds itself paralysed.

#### Commercial & ecclesiastical law

The land-based equivalent of Admiralty law is international commercial law. Both systems, lacking a basis in even common law, fail to establish and afford protection for individual or group rights, and produce fertile ground for 'might is right.' And 'might is right' is the easy entry level to totalitarianism. The image of a pagan goddess cannot represent freedom, but it can represent satanic repression through man's worldwide government. To this can be linked an end-time revival of that other 'international' legal system, the ecclesiastical law of the Roman Catholic Church which has suffered varying degrees of rebuff ever since Henry VIII totally repudiated 'Church law,'33 so setting the foundation of the modern sovereign state. The end-time worldwide government will signal the demise of independent sovereignty for the modern nation-state, and herald the cataclysmic events foretold in biblical prophecy. 'Absolute power corrupts absolutely,' unfortunately.

Thus the reality of the linkage between restriction of personal freedom and the laws of man is abundantly clear. Man's laws are repressive, and serve only the interests of the ruling or controlling elite for whom the ordinary man is a slave.

World War V:	Presaged in the 'first' and 'second woes,' cf. Rev 9:1-21. The former woe lasts for 150 days, only afflicting
	those who have taken the mark of the Beast, without inducing death. The latter, involving 'two hundred
	million' combatants, lasts for 'a time: a day, a month, and a year, for to slay the third part of man,' cf. Rev
	9:15-16; v.15, correct translation, reads: 'prepared for the season: a day, a month, and a year,' from the
	Greek <u>hora</u> , 'time' or 'season.' These form the 5th and 6th trumpets of the 7th seal—part of 'The Day of the
	Lord.'
World War VI:	The battle on the return of our Lord Jesus Christ is recited in Rev 19:11-21. The world-girdling nature of it
	and the outcome is given in Rev 19:19-21, 'And I saw the beast, and the kings of the earth, and their
	armies, gathered together to make war against him that sat on the horse, and against his army. And the
	beast was taken, and with him the false prophetThese both were cast alive into a lake of fire burning
	with brimstone. And the remnant were slain with the sword of him that sat on the horse.'
World War VII:	The final world war, closing off all, occurs at the end of the Millennium of rest. Satan is bound in the pit for
	the entire of the Millennium, as seen from Rev 20:1-3. What happens thereafter is described in Rev 20:7-
	9, 'And when the thousand years are expired, Satan shall be loosed out of his prison, And shall go out to
	deceive the nations which are in the four quarters of the earth, Gog and Magog, to gather then together to
	battle: the number of whom is as the sand of the sea. And they went up on the breadth of the earth, and
	compassed the camp of the saints about, and the beloved city: and fire came down from God out of
	heaven, and devoured them. <sup>87</sup>
